FOREWORD

Opening a new critical field on Inuit culture

In all cultures, there comes a time when we must choose, collect, record, index and study the texts published in periodicals, magazines and newspapers which is the first step in forming an organized written heritage.

For those who study it, Inuit culture is a fascinating and highly complex case of how our contemporary era understands a mixture between oral and written material enduring and continuing with contemporary oral performances such as spoken word or verbal jousting, but also more and more through written material. This culture takes shape in the coexistence and use of languages (Inuktitut, English and French) that contradict some preconceived ideas. It does for the time being without a formal centre for consecration, but in connection with a larger whole, consisting of the Inuit circumpolar world which itself is undergoing deep tensions between a colonial influence still felt and a desire for a sometimes contested pan-Inuit cohesion. Deeply rooted both in the necessary and the essential, Inuit culture brings a unique message in an original way. In this sense, it has a rightful place in the universal cultural heritage.

A researcher used to researching archives, manuscripts and cultural resources, is confronted with a considerable, fundamental problem in the Inuit case. The traces of its cultural emergence, even recent ones, have not been systematically institutionalized and inventoried.

The researcher will thus search in vain in libraries, cultural histories, dictionaries and scientific articles for information on an Inuit author, artist or politician. One will even seek uncomfortably early Inuit publications, as they are dispersed in places few and far between.

Studying the Inuit cultural heritage requires much preparatory work: finding the texts, tracing their places of publication, their contexts and their sources in a process that is more of an investigation in the field than documentary research. It is necessary, in order to sustain the corpus and its renewal, and also, for it to be known and studied, to create and maintain tools to be used both by the Inuit and researchers interested in discovering their cultural heritage.

From the beginning of Inuit writing until today, a substantial amount of texts, including journalistic writings, were printed and have circulated in periodicals, of which, until now, neither the number, the extent, nor wealth were known. These periodicals are mostly little known to the public, even in Inuit communities—in this context, it also goes without saying that they have rarely been studied or put into a historical perspective. That is why the field work carried out here by Sharon Rankin opens a rich and unique cultural research field.

AVANT-PROPOS

Ouvrir un vaste chantier critique sur la culture inuite

Dans toutes les cultures, il vient un temps nécessaire où il faut choisir, rassembler, consigner, inventorier et étudier les textes publiés dans les périodiques, première étape de la constitution organisée d'un patrimoine écrit.

Pour qui l'observe, la culture inuite est un cas fascinant et hautement complexe de l'époque contemporaine où se vit la concurrence de toutes les formes de diffusion, dans un mélange entre l'oral et l'écrit qui ne se consume pas (et qui ne se consumera peut-être jamais, à en voir les prestations orales contemporaines, telles celles du *spoken word* ou des joutes orales). Cette culture prend forme dans une cohabitation et une utilisation des langues (l'inuktitut, l'anglais et le français) qui contredit certaines idées préconçues; elle le fait pour l'instant sans centre affirmé de consécration, mais en relation avec un tout plus grand, formé du monde inuit circumpolaire qui vit lui-même des tensions profondes entre des influences coloniales toujours ressenties et une volonté de cohésion pan-inuite parfois contestée. Profondément traversée par le nécessaire et l'essentiel, la culture inuite apporte de manière originale un message unique. En ce sens, elle trouve une place de plein droit dans le patrimoine culturel universel.

Le chercheur habitué aux recherches d'archives, de manuscrits et de sources culturelles se confronte, avec le cas inuit, à un problème de base considérable: les traces, même récentes, de son émergence

n'ont pas été systématiquement institutionnalisées et inventoriées. On cherchera ainsi en vain dans les bibliothèques, les histoires culturelles, les dictionnaires et les articles scientifiques tel renseignement sur un auteur, un artiste ou un politicien inuit: on cherchera même malaisément les premières publications inuites, tellement elles sont inégalement dispersées dans quelques lieux épars.

Étudier le patrimoine culturel inuit impose un lourd travail en amont: trouver les textes, retracer leurs lieux de publication, leur contexte et leurs sources dans une démarche qui relève plus de l'enquête sur le terrain que de la recherche documentaire. Il est nécessaire, pour assurer la pérennité du corpus et son renouvellement, ainsi que pour permettre sa connaissance et son étude, de créer et de maintenir à jour des instruments qui serviront tant aux Inuits eux-mêmes qu'aux chercheurs intéressés à en découvrir le patrimoine culturel.

Depuis l'apprentissage de l'écriture jusqu'à nos jours, une quantité substantielle de textes, y compris des écrits journalistiques, ont été écrits et diffusés dans des périodiques, dont on ne connaissait jusqu'à maintenant ni le nombre, ni l'ampleur, ni la richesse. Ces périodiques ne sont pour la plupart que peu connus du public, même dans les communautés inuites – dans ce contexte, il va aussi sans dire qu'ils ont très rarement été étudiés ou mis en perspective de manière historique. Voilà pourquoi le travail de terrain réalisé ici par Sharon Rankin permet d'ouvrir un chantier de recherche culturelle riche et inédit.

INTRODUCTION

This bibliography is an annotated source of information about the magazines, journals, newspapers and newsletters published by and about Canada's Inuit peoples and communities. The entries span over 100 years of publication beginning with the first Canadian Inuktitut periodical published in Labrador in 1902, entitled *Aglait Illunainortut*.

In the 1940s and 1950s, Catholic and Anglican missionaries began to publish bilingual, English and Inuktitut magazines. In the 1960s, Inuit communities began publishing their own newspapers and in the 1970s and 1980s there was an explosion of Inuit journalism in the North. Inuit associations throughout Canada began to publish newsletters and magazines containing information about their activities and encouraging dialogue about northern issues, such as land claims, self-government, aboriginal rights, economic development, social policy and the preservation of traditional knowledge. Within the pages of these periodicals, one will find the early prose of now famous Inuit authors¹. Many periodicals did not survive the government funding cuts of the late 20th century, but several did, including *Inuktitut Magazine*, the longest continuously published Inuit magazine in Canada. There were over thirty Canadian Inuit periodicals being published as of 2010.

It is anticipated that this publication will be useful as an overview of the publishing history of Canadian Inuit periodicals. These publications

are a valuable primary research source and they record the evolution of Canadian Inuit society. The entries in this bibliography were constructed to provide as much information about the publication as possible, to enable one to easily judge the relevancy of the publication to one's line of inquiry. The Canadian libraries containing significant holdings of the title are named. If online versions of the publication were located, a URL link is included. For the few periodicals that have been indexed, the databases containing indexed articles have been named.

In 2007, information began to be collected for this bibliography by reviewing past publications and identifying holdings in library catalogues and online periodical indexes. The sources used to compile this work are listed in the sections entitled "References consulted", "Library catalogues consulted" and "Indexes and Abstracts consulted". Whenever possible actual issues of the publication were examined and a sample cover page of each publication has been included.

The entries will continue to receive updating in the online version of this publication. Entitled *Caninuit*², this web database was launched in 2008. *Caninuit* can be browsed by title, category or geographic region or searched by any word. Noted errors and omissions are gratefully accepted and can be communicated to the editor online at www.libris.ca/inuit/contact.exe.

ORGANIZATION

The entries in this bibliography have been arranged in alphabetical order by periodical title.

The fields in each entry, with notes about their contents are described below.

Tags

Tags are subject terms assigned to describe the general subject contents of the publication. The subject terms have been selected from the controlled vocabulary in the *ASTIS Subject Thesaurus*, available online at http://www.aina.ucalgary.ca/ast.

Format

Each record has been given one of the following format types: "Journal", "Magazine", "Newsletter", "Newspaper" or "Catalogue". The format "Journal" was used if it could be determined that the publication has some form of editorial board or peer review, if not, then the format "Magazine" was used. "Newspaper" was used if the publication contains community news and "Newsletter" was used if the publication contains specific association news. "Catalogue" was used for annual publications of Inuit art.

Coverage

The starting volume, date range and frequency of publication of the periodical are included in this field, if known.

Languages The languages printed in the periodical are entered

in this field.

Illustrations Notes about the type of illustrations contained within the periodical are entered in this field.

Publisher The name of the organization responsible

for publishing the periodical is entered in this field.

Editor The editors of the periodical, if known, are entered in chronological order.

Address The city or community and the province or territory where the publisher resided at the time of publication is entered in this field.

Link A URL link to the publisher's web site is entered in this field.

ISSN The international standard serial number assigned to the publication is entered in this field.

Library The name of the Canadian library or libraries with substantive holdings of the publication is entered in this field.

Online A URL link to online issues of the publication is entered in this field.

Indexing If the periodical has been indexed, the name of the index is entered. More information about the indexes can be found in the section "Indexes and Abstracts consulted".

INTRODUCTION

Cette bibliographie annotée dresse le bilan des magazines, revues, journaux et bulletins publiés par les Inuits du Canada ou à leur sujet depuis plus de 100 ans—plus précisément depuis la parution du tout premier périodique canadien en inuktitut, *Aglait Illunainortut*, au Labrador en 1902.

Les missionnaires catholiques et anglicans ont commencé de publier des magazines bilingues, en inuktitut et en anglais, dans les années 1940 et 1950. Dans les années 1960, les collectivités inuites se sont attachées à faire paraître leurs propres journaux. Les années 1970 et 1980 ont ainsi été marquées par un essor extraordinaire du journalisme inuit dans le Nord. Dans toutes les régions du Canada, des associations inuites ont entrepris de publier des bulletins et des magazines pour faire connaître leurs activités et stimuler la réflexion sur les grands enjeux nordiques, notamment les revendications territoriales, l'autonomie gouvernementale, les droits des Autochtones, le développement économique, les politiques sociales et la préservation des savoirs traditionnels. Ces périodiques ont ainsi diffusé les premiers textes d'auteurs inuits ayant acquis depuis une enviable renommée¹. Si de nombreux titres n'ont pas survécu aux coupures budgétaires gouvernementales de la fin du 20^e siècle, plusieurs sont encore bien vivaces. C'est notamment le cas d'Inuktitut Magazine, qui détient le record de la publication ininterrompue pour l'ensemble des magazines

inuits du Canada. On dénombrait en 2010 plus de trente périodiques inuits canadiens.

Le présent document rend compte de l'histoire de la publication des périodiques inuits au Canada. Ces titres témoignent avec précision de l'évolution de la société inuite canadienne et constituent pour les chercheurs autant de sources primaires essentielles. Cette bibliographie les présente de manière à fournir l'information la plus exhaustive possible sur chacun d'eux, ce qui permet au lecteur d'évaluer rapidement leur pertinence par rapport aux thèmes qui l'intéressent. Pour chacun de ces périodiques, elle indique les bibliothèques canadiennes qui en possèdent un nombre appréciable d'exemplaires et, s'il a été mis en ligne, l'adresse URL du site correspondant. Pour les rares périodiques ayant fait l'objet d'une indexation, cette bibliographie mentionne en outre les bases de données contenant les articles indexés.

L'information nécessaire à l'établissement du présent document a commencé d'être collectée en 2007 par l'analyse de références bibliographiques, d'index en ligne et de catalogues de bibliothèques. On trouvera ces sources sous les rubriques «Références consultées», «Index et résumés consultés» et «Catalogues de bibliothèques consultés», respectivement. Dans toute la mesure du possible, ce document a aussi été élaboré à partir d'exemplaires du périodique et présente l'une de ses couvertures.



Aglait Illunainortut

Aglait Illunainortut translates as "Things written for everyone". Launched in 1902, this seasonally published newspaper was assembled by missionaries and, later, by Inuit writers. It was typeset by hand, printed on a manual press, and distributed by dogsled to all the communities on the northern coast of Labrador. The first issues were small folded sheets and by 1915, the publication had grown to several pages with photographs and illustrations. The Moravian missionaries claim that this is the first Eskimo newspaper in the history of the world.
